

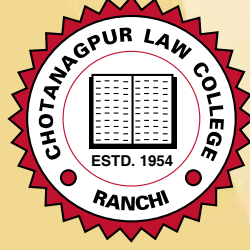

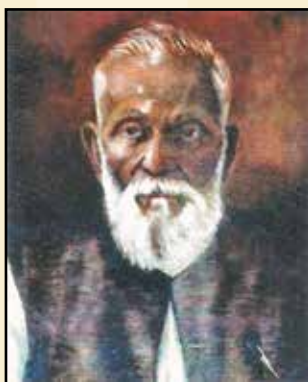

“प्राचार्य के कलम से”

छोटानागपुर विधि महाविद्यालय की स्थापना सन् 1954 में बैरिस्टर एस.के. सहाय के द्वारा उन काल एवं परिस्थितियों में हुई जब कि देश शीघ्र ही स्वतंत्रता प्राप्त किये हुये था, और देश के समक्ष गरीबी, अशिक्षा एवं बेकारी की स्थिति भयावह थी। वैसे सम्पूर्ण भारत वर्ष में ही विधि शिक्षण संस्थाओं का अभाव महसूस किया जा रहा था, विशेषकर इस आदिवासी बाहुल्य क्षेत्र में तो ऐसे संस्थाओं का सर्वथा अभाव था। ऐसे में बैरिस्टर एस.के. सहाय की दूरदृष्टि एवं यहाँ की जनता के सार्थक प्रयास से इस पुनित संस्था का अभ्युदय संभव हो सका। आरम्भिक समय में यह संस्था बिहार विश्वविद्यालय, मुजफरपुर से संबद्ध रहा लेकिन ज्योंही राँची विश्वविद्यालय की स्थापना हुई यह संस्था राँची विश्वविद्यालय का संबद्ध इकाई बना। सन् 1982 में मैं इस संस्था से जुड़ा। मुझे स्मरण है कि महाविद्यालय इस लम्बी यात्रा में अनेक कीर्तिमान जनमानस के समक्ष स्थापित किये। देश के सर्वोच्च न्यायालय में एवं कई उच्च न्यायालयों में यहाँ के भुतपूर्व छात्र अपने फ़ैसलों के माध्यम से राष्ट्र को नये तरीके से मार्गदर्शित कर रहे हैं। विगत कालों में संस्था को अनेक झंझवालों को भी झेलना पड़ा है, इसके बावजूद भी राष्ट्र एवं राज्य के स्तर पर एक प्रतिष्ठित विधि महाविद्यालय के रूप यह अपने अस्मिता को बनाये हुए हैं। प्रतिवर्ष यहाँ के छात्र मूटकोर्ट प्रतियोगिता, युवा संसद इत्यादि प्रतियोगिता में भी राष्ट्रीय स्तर पर अपने अमिट पहचान बनाते हैं। मैं संस्था के प्रबंध समिति, शिक्षकों, शिक्षकेत्तर कर्मचारियों एवं छात्र-छात्राओं को हार्दिक धन्यवाद ज्ञापित करता हूँ कि इसके सतत विकास के निमित्त ये तन-मन से प्रयत्नशील हैं। वर्तमान एवं भावी छात्र-छात्राओं के प्रति संदेश है कि -

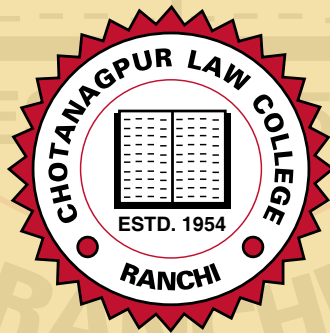

Introduction

Chotanagpur Law College, Ranchi, established in the year 1954 in the heart of Ranchi, it is one of the oldest college imparting legal education in Bihar, at present in Jharkhand and pioneer institution of the Chotanagpur Region. The college was started by the effort of great legal luminaries of Ranchi town of which Late lamented S. K. Sahay, Bar-at-law was the leader. He was also the founder Principal of the College. The college was initially affiliated to Bihar University and thereafter to Ranchi University, Ranchi. The college was shifted to the new premises namely Nyay Vihar Campus in the year 2008 which is situated on NH 33 (Ranchi - Tata Road) and is just 9 k.m. from the center of the city.

The college has played a great role in producing the law graduates who have occupied the post of Justices of Hon'ble Supreme Court, Hon'ble High Courts, District Judges and Judicial Officers in District Courts. The teaching in the College is based on the new syllabus as per instruction of the Bar Council of India. The teaching standard of the College is at par the best legal institutions in the country.

Duration of the 3 years LL.B. Programme

The duration of course is three academic years divided into Six Semesters styled as LL.B. Part-1, Part-2 & Part-3, and also 1st, 2nd, 3rd, 4th, 5th, and 6th Semesters. To clear Part-1 student has to pass University Exam of 1st and 2nd Semesters, to Clear Part-2 student has to pass University exam of 3rd and 4th Semester and to clear LL.B. Part-3 student has to pass 5th and 6th Semesters including aggregate of pass marks in all the previous Semesters. However, a student is not prohibited to take admission in LL.B. Part-2 or Part-3 without passing the University Exam of 1st and 2nd Semesters and/or without passing 3rd and 4th Semesters.

Medium

The medium of instruction and examination is English/Hindi. This has been implemented keeping in mind the convenience and understanding of students who come from different educational background. The college ensures that the students are taught in the language and a medium which is convenient to all of them.

Academic Year

The academic year starts from the month of July and ends in the month of June next year. A student admitted in one session ceases to be the student of the College at the end of session. For each Part student has to take fresh admission. It is not essential for a student to pass University examination to take admission in Part-2 and Part-3. Every year the college publishes its academic calendar which explains all the details regarding academic activities of that session. It is overall on the website of the college.

Eligibility for Admission & Pattern of Selection

Minimum eligibility for admission in 3 years LL.B. course as per the Bar Council of India Rules part IV. A graduate of a recognized university or who passes such academic qualification which is considered equivalent to a graduate degree of a university by the Bar Council of India, New Delhi, is eligible to appear in the Entrance Test for admission in LL.B. Part-1 (Semester System). Appearing candidate in final year examination of graduation may also apply. The programme for the admission test is scheduled to be published by 1st of April, the Entrance Test is scheduled to be conducted by 1st Sunday of July and the result of Entrance Test is scheduled to be published by 3rd week of July and the classes are scheduled to commence from last week of July every year. Syllabus of entrance test is printed on the reverse side of Admit Card. The eligibility score of LSAT is also considered for admission.

Admission Form and Prospectus for LL.B. Part-1 are available in the College Office generally in the first week of April every year. The same may be obtained on payment of Rs. 1000/- only (including the

entrance test fee) at the office counter during any working day.

The application form duly completed in all respect must reach the College office on or before the last date fixed for that purpose. The form received after the scheduled date will not be considered. The Roll Number of students who have been found qualified for the admission will be notified on the college notice board, local news papers and official website of the college (www.cnlawcollege.org). Students migrating from other Universities are required to produce migration certificate from that university within 60 days after admission. Failure to do so may result in cancellation of admission.

Student belonging to Schedule Tribes, Schedule Castes or Backward Classes (Annex.I & II) must clearly indicate their category in the application form and should be supported with certificate from the competent authority issued by Jharkhand State, otherwise the students concerned will be denied the reservation / concessions available to them. Students belonging to Backward Classes Annex-I must also submit income certificate from the competent authority.

Ragging is strictly prohibited in the college Campus. Any matter regarding it, may be informed to the competent authority or to the Principal. (Ph. N. : 0651-2261050, Anti-Ragging Cell)

THE E-CHALLAN MAY BE OBTAINED AND E-PAYMENT CAN BE MADE BY THE PAYMENT PORTAL IN THE COLLEGE WEBSITE, (WWW.CNLAWCOLLEGE.ORG). THE COMPLETED APPLICATION FORM WITH REQUIRED DOCUMENTS MUST BE SUBMITTED IN THE OFFICE OF COLLEGE ON OR BEFORE THE NOTIFIED DATE CONCERNING ACADEMIC CALENDAR (SESSION WISE)

IDENTITY-CUM-LIBRARY CARD

- **Students Council:**

In order to inculcate a democratic environment in the institution. The college has a students council. The student council is a representative body for the betterment and growth of the institution as well as for the student's welfare. It is a statutory body constituted by the Governing Body of the college. The members of the council are nominated (on the basis of merit) and elected (by the nominated members) for one academic year. The main object is to enhance and explore the knowledge as well as to groom interactive skills of the students. The institution invites various academicians and jurists from all over the country.

Abstract of University Regulation Relating to Examination

Scheme of Examination:

The examination of 1st, 3rd and 5th semesters shall commence in the first week of December each year and the examination of 2nd, 4th & 6th Semester shall commence in the 1st week of May every year. Internal assessment shall be based on mid term internal examination/internal assessment/attendance and home work assigned from time to time by the subject teachers, etc.

Results of Examination:

Results of each Semester Examination are usually declared within six weeks of conclusion of the respective Semester Examination. The students waiting for their results are allowed to attend classes on provisional basis in the next Semesters.

Minimum Pass Marks:

No candidate shall be declared to have passed the LL.B. Examination, unless he/she obtains minimum 33% marks in each theory paper separately, in practical papers only those students shall be declared to have passed who obtains 33% marks in theory paper and in practical examination taken together. Student has also to secure 40% marks in Viva-Voce including Field Work. The candidate shall be required to obtain at least 45% marks in aggregate taking theory and practical papers together in each Semester for being declared to have passed the examination. A candidate securing 5 marks less than pass marks either in theory paper or practical paper or aggregate shall be declared to have passed the examination under regulation. This regulation may be availed by a candidate only once in all six Semester Examinations.

No Candidate shall be admitted to examination of 3rd Semester (LL.B. 2nd year) unless he/she has completed the course of 3rd Semester and passed at least 50% of the subjects of 1st & 2nd Semester Examination unless he/she has completed the course of 5th Semester (LL.B. 3rd year) and Passed 50% of the subjects of 3rd & 4th Semester Examination together.

The maximum period of completing the three-year LL.B. programme shall be double the duration stipulated from the programme reckoned from the year of admission. The term "completing the programme" means passing all the prescribed examination of the programme to become eligible for the degree. No candidate shall be permitted to appear for the examination after expiry of maximum period prescribed for completing the programme.

A student who has failed in any Semester Examination shall be exempted from appearing in the subjects in which he/she has obtained at least 45% marks.

Subject of Study

Each theory paper shall carry 50 marks which includes 10 marks on internal assessment.

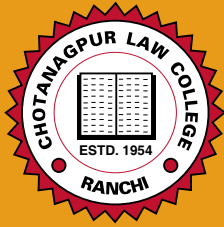
